

# Fountains



**Aqualens:** Allison's most popular piece was designed 1999, as the centerpiece of a show garden at the 2000 Chelsea Flower Show , where she won a silver medal on her debut for "Garden of Reflections" (also incorporating 4 mirrored Obelisks).The fountain is based on a 600mm (2 foot) diameter acrylic sphere, filled and overflowing with water from a concealed pump. Aqualens sets this on a circular stainless steel platform, which in turn is set in a 1.5metre (5 feet) diameter stainless steel contact-lens dish pool. The pool can be dug into a lawn, or set on a terrace or other firm level surface (the pool has a fitted collar so it sits level). We now create Aqualens up to 2 meters.

Operation and maintenance are simple: place the pool in your chosen spot, put in the platform, sphere and pump, fill with water and plug in the lead for the electric pump. **Aqua Sphere:** set in a 1.45m square black polycarbonate pool, the acrylic sphere fountain (like Aqualens) is set on a square platform and normally finished in stainless steel for maximum reflective effect.



**Teepee:** a 2m high sculpture in interlinked stainless steel triangles. It is set on a 1.5m circular base, with a back plate where it may be positioned against a wall. A fountain is set inside the Teepee, with three intersecting water jets.



**Mesa:** a pyramid shaped set of ten stainless steel square plates, set in a 1.2m square pool.
