

Drexel Bench

Drexel Avenue lies in the heart of South Beach; the Drexel bench recalls the streamlined Art Deco buildings along that avenue. Its fine upholstered seat rests comfortably in a tray-like bentwood foundation. An elegant metal base forms the underpinning. A welcome addition to private offices, lounge areas, and other public spaces, the Drexel bench combines upholstery, wood, and metal for a refreshing appearance.



Specifications

The stainless steel bench is available in 4 lengths with an upholstered seat. The base is constructed of maple veneer supported by a welded and smoothed stainless steel base, available in Polished, Satin or Statuary Bronze. The seat is 4" thick multi-density polyurethane foam. Catalyzed lacquer finish in all Cumberland Maple finishes. Also available in Option A Exotic Woods.

Notes on the optional use of Option A Woods and Finishes

Option A Woods are species, not finishes. By default, they are offered as shown on the samples and in the finish selector with little or no stain added, to show their natural beauty. Option A Woods can also be finished in the standard MP-Finishes, as long as the Option A Wood is lighter than the standard finish you select.
