



# LUIS VIDAL Spain



Luis Vidal was born in Barcelona (Spain) and currently lives and works in Madrid.

He studied architecture at the University of Greenwich (London, UK), where he graduated with honours in 1994 and was admitted as a member of the RIBA in 1995. He specialised mainly in airports, offices, houses and museums. From 1998 to 2001 he was assistant professor in projects and design at the Polytechnic University of Madrid (ETSAM). Between 1999 and 2003, he was Managing Director at Lamela Arquitectos (LA), where he became a partner in 2000. During this stage of his career, Vidal was Project Director of the New Terminal for Madrid Barajas Airport, a joint venture project with Richard Rogers Partnership (RRP) which started in 1996 and ended in 2003.

In 2003, he started his own company, Vidal y Asociados Arquitectos (VAa). Shortly thereafter (1994), Luis Vidal teamed up with Richard Rogers Partnership in Spain. Since then, VAa has been awarded the first prize in competitions such as the New Terminal for Zaragoza Airport and the Vallecas Hospital, in association with Berne Araujo SL. With Richard Rogers Partnership, VAa has won international competitions, such as the development of a Sustainable Business Park in Seville, as well as the Master Plan for 90 ha. of land in Valladolid's city centre, including the Rearrangement of the Valladolid Central Railway Network.

He has also been awarded the first prize in interior design competitions, such as the Arola restaurant at the Reina Sofia Museum extension in Madrid. More recently, the company has been commissioned by an international hotel chain to renovate an emblematic hotel in the centre of Madrid, and has received a grant for a Research and Development project on sustainable materials and building skins.
